Community Use Covid-19 Protocols

Community Use of Schools (CUS) programs have been re-opening across the province. As we plan to re-open CUS in KPR schools, our priorities are the health and safety of staff, students and participants. Please read the following Covid-19 re-opening protocols.

We will be limiting indoor use of schools to **weekends only (Friday evenings to Sundays), to allow school spaces to be thoroughly cleaned before classes resume on Mondays.**

CUS will **initially be limited to secondary schools and one elementary school in each ASG.**

Spaces available for use will be **limited to school gyms and one classroom per school.**

Spectators will not be allowed for adult groups, and only one spectator per participant will be allowed for youth groups.

Each organization must have a COVID-19 Safety Plan for KPR Facilities. This will be reviewed and approved by Community Use before the permit is approved.

Any fines associated with non-compliance of Provincial or Public Health regulations will be the responsibility of the permit holder and cannot be passed onto KPRDSB.

Permit supervisor must ensure that each person who enters the facility completes a COVID-19 screening **PRIOR** to entering the facility for **EVERY** booking. Participants will use Ontario's self-assessment tool to complete the daily screening before each entry to a school.

Permit supervisor **must verify proof of vaccination for each person aged 12+** who enters a KPRDSB facility for a community use of schools permit. It is the responsibility of the permit supervisor to ensure that this is completed before entry to the facility.

Permit supervisor must complete the KPR CUS Booking Check In Attestation upon entry to the facility for each booking (using the QR code found at the entrance).

Permit supervisor must keep records of each person who attends each session for contact tracing purposes should it be required with regard to a positive case. Records must be kept for at least 1 month post permit and be provided to Public Health if requested.

Permit supervisor will arrive no earlier than 30 minutes prior to their permitted time and all participants will enter as a group, no earlier than 15 minutes prior to the permitted time (once all screening has been completed).

Participants must leave the building immediately after the permit and no later than 10 minutes after the end of the permitted time.

Participants showing any symptoms of illness are not allowed entry to KPRDSB facilities.

Every person shall wear a face covering that covers both the mouth and nose for the duration of their stay within the facility. This includes walking in hallways to and from a gymnasium. The only exception is



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when actively engaged in sports or exercise.

Upon entry and exit to schools, each person shall use hand sanitizer. (Not provided by KPR)

Every person involved in an approved permitted activity must maintain a 2m (6 ft.) distance between each other if they are not from the same household/cohort except when they are actively engaging in sports or games at the facility.

Posted occupancy limits must be followed.

There will not be access to showers.

Participants must use only the entry point and exit door outlined on the permit, or as indicated by the custodian or principal.

If an outbreak is declared by Public Health at your permit site, it will be automatically cancelled.

Failure to comply with any COVID-19 protocols, or KPR protocols, will result in the cancellation of the permit.
