Meeting Purpose

- Kaawaate East City PS is experiencing significant accommodation pressures.
- Relieving accommodation pressure at Kaawaate East City PS is a priority for the Board.
- Both immediate and long-term solutions need to be considered in order to manage student accommodation pressures at this school and at other schools in the City and County.
- The purpose of tonight's meeting is to provide information related to the Boards immediate plan and to receive feedback from the community.

 KPR is experiencing uneven growth across our schools in the City and County of Peterborough, which has led to critical overcrowding in some schools and extra space in others.

• KPR will be launching a broader review of secondary and elementary school boundaries and family of school groupings to identify long-term strategies to manage this growth.



• The process will take place over the next 13 months, and will include all families of schools within the City and County of Peterborough:

- Adam Scott CVI Family of Schools,
- Crestwood SS Family of School,
- Kenner CVI Family of Schools,
- Norwood District HS Family of Schools, and
- Thomas A. Stewart Family of Schools.

- Community Engagement opportunities will take place in April/May 2024 and families will be invited to provide feedback on long-term accommodation plans.
- Administration will consolidate this feedback and bring a summary to the Board in the Fall of 2024, along with proposed options for consideration.
- Further community meetings on the draft options will be held in the Fall of 2024 for feedback.

- Final recommendations will be brought forward to the Board of Trustees by December 2024.
- Long-term accommodation strategies may be implemented using a phased approach.
- The first phase will be effective September 2025.


- In 2016, the Board of Trustees made the decision to consolidate the former King George PS and Armour Heights PS at the King George PS site.
- The Ministry of Education approved the construction of a 674 pupil-place school. Business case at the time included the following projections:
 - Projected to be at 99% utilization at opening (2017-2018)
 - Projected to be at 103% utilization by 2021-2022
 - Projected to be at 102% utilization by 2025-2026

- Kaawaate East City PS opened its door to students in September 2021 at 101% utilization with 684 students.
- 2023-2024 enrolment at Kaawaate East City PS is 785 students (116% utilization).
- The French Immersion (FI) program continues to be phased in over the next two (2) years, with Grade 6 being phased in this school year (2023-2024).

- A fourth portable classroom was placed at the site to accommodate increased enrolment levels – the site cannot accommodate any additional portable classrooms.
- All special purpose rooms within the school facility, have been converted to regular classroom spaces.
- With the exception of the learning commons, there are no more spaces within the school to accommodate students.
- Both immediate and long-term solutions need to be considered to manage student accommodation pressures at this school.

- Change in demographics.
- Increased student yields from the on-going residential development activity (east side of Television Road) within the Kaawaate East City PS attendance area.
- Kindergarten capture rates within the school attendance area have increased by approximately 15% since the opening of Kaawaate East City PS.







Proposed Accommodation Measure – Changes in Program Structure

- To manage immediate pressures being experienced at this school, the Board is proposing Grades 7 and 8 French Immersion students attend Adam Scott Intermediate School, beginning September 2024.
 - Kaawaate East City PS would become a JK to Grade 6 dualtrack and Grades 7-8 English stream school.

- A summary report, along with a recommendation for the Board of Trustees to consider for the proposed accommodation solution, will be presented at the January 23, 2024, Board meeting.
- The Board will commence with a broader City and County of Peterborough Accommodation Planning process this winter/spring.
