



## Your Child's Immunization Records

It is the responsibility of parents and guardians to ensure their child's immunization records are up-to-date with Lakelands Public Health. Please note that the Health Unit does not receive automatic updates from doctors when your child receives a vaccination.

### Steps to Ensure Your Child's Immunization Records are Up to Date:



#### CHECK

- Review your child's yellow immunization card or health record.
- Verify your child's immunization records with your doctor for any missing vaccines.



#### VACCINATE

- Ensure your child receives any missing vaccinations or has a valid exemption.
- Contact your doctor or the Health Unit to book an immunization appointment if needed.



#### UPDATE

Update your child's immunization record with the Health Unit.

## Why is This Important?

Keeping immunizations up-to-date helps protect children and the community from vaccine preventable diseases. By ensuring your child's records are current, you help prevent outbreaks.

The Immunization of School Pupils Act (ISPA) R.S.O.1990 requires all students in Ontario to be vaccinated, or have a valid exemption, against tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis, polio, measles, mumps, rubella, meningococcal disease, and varicella. The Health Unit is required to maintain and review vaccine records and exemptions for every student attending school within the County of Haliburton, the City of Kawartha Lakes, Peterborough, and Northumberland County.
